

A subject may be more than one word.

For example:

The Trans-Canada Highway stretches from east to west.
(This complete subject has more than one word.)

There may also be more than one subject in a sentence.

For example:

The United States and Canada are neighbours.
(There are two subjects.)

Exercise 1

Find the subject or subjects in each sentence below. Put a circle around each.

For example: Canada is a huge country.

1. Canada is part of the continent of North America.
2. It covers most of the northern part of the continent.
3. The United States is slightly smaller than Canada.
4. Canada is 4 627 km long when measured from north to south.
5. Canada has long coastlines.
6. The Canadian coastline measures 243 797 km.
7. The three oceans are the Pacific Ocean, the Atlantic Ocean, and the Arctic Ocean.
8. An inland sea is formed by Hudson Bay and James Bay.
9. Forests cover about one-third of the land.
10. Mountains and wasteland make up more than half the total land.
